If you have discovered a missing or lost drivers license or your card has been damaged beyond readability, then you must replace it as soon as possible. Luckily, the Missouri drivers license replacement process is a simple one that must be directed in person at any driver license office managed by the Missouri Department of Revenue (DOR). You will need to submit certain information about your driving record as well as pay a fee for a duplicate card. If you need to replace lost drivers license document, especially if you suspect theft. Doing so helps to protect you in the event that your original drivers license get used for identity theft or other fraudulent purposes. Continue reading the sections outlined below to learn how to replace drivers license credentials in Missouri? Missouri state law requires every driver to be in possession of a valid copy of drivers license documentation whenever operating a motor vehicle, so replacing it is imperative any time a license is lost, stolen or mutilated. You also need a replacement drivers license if your name, address or gender has changed or if your credential. Simply put, every licensed Missouri driver must replace documentation as soon as possible after it becomes mutilated, goes missing or it is no longer up to date. How to Replace Your Missouri Drivers License To replace drivers license documentation in person, visit one of the MO DOR license offices during normal business hours. You should call ahead before replacing drivers license documentation in person because hours and 4 p.m. on non-holiday weekdays and some offer extended weekend hours. Missouri does not currently offer drivers the option of ordering a drivers license copy online but you may use the MO DOR's online app if you need to update your driver license address on file before applying for a license address on file before addres First, you may only apply for a DMV duplicate license in MO if your current license is not due to expire within six months (184 days) of the date of your requests for credentials due to expire within the next six months will be processed as a drivers license renewal instead of a replacement. Second, you must provide one acceptable proof of identity. The DOR provides an extensive list of acceptable identification documents and prefers to receive documents that include a U.S. passport, a military ID card, a student ID card or a work ID card. You will be required to submit the following valid, original documents demonstrating proof of each item at the time you apply: Identity (one acceptable document to verify full legal name and date of birth); Lawful Status in the United States (one acceptable document to verify United States citizenship or immigration status); Social Security Number (one acceptable document); Missouri residencial address); and Additional items, such as a certified marriage license or court order, may be required to verify a new or prior name change if your name is different from the name on your identity and date of birth verification documents required to apply for your REAL ID. You may also refer to our complete list of acceptable documents for REAL IDcompliant license and ID card processing. IMPORTANT: When applying for a REAL ID-compliant license or ID card, please allow time for its processing and mailing (typically 10-15 days). If you need to fly on October 1, 2021, and you wait to renew until September 30, 2021, you will not receive your REAL ID-compliant license or ID card in time to fly. Consider renewing no later than September 1, 2021, if you will need to fly on or soon after October 1, 2021, to allow sufficient time for delivery of your license or ID card. MILITARY POLICY CHANGE The U.S. Department of Defense (DoD) recently finalized an update to its DoD-wide installation security policy and is in the process of no longer accepting noncompliant marked cards across all of its facilities and installations. This means the military is in the process of no longer accepting driver licenses or nondriver identification cards marked as being noncompliant with REAL ID for the purposes of accessing a military base. This policy change impacts DoD installations in all states, not just Missouri. Prior to October 1, 2021, military bases will accept licenses and ID cards marked as being REAL ID-compliant or Missouri licenses and ID cards issued prior to March 25, 2019, which have no REAL ID marking, compliant or noncompliant. In Missouri, a license or ID card that is noncompliant with REAL ID will have "NOT FOR REAL ID" PURPOSES" in the upper right-hand corner. Anyone attempting to access a military base with a Missouri-issued license or ID card marked as "NOT FOR REAL ID PURPOSES" may be denied entry. To ensure you have the proper identification, you should contact the military base you plan to visit in advance to obtain information regarding identification requirement A drivers who is between the ages of 16-17 is issued an intermediate license that expires up to two years* from the date issued. Endorsements Endorsements are just the opposite of restrictions because they qualify you to do things you couldn't do without the endorsement. Motorcycle License (M) - You must have a Class M license or permit (or a driver license with the M endorsement) if you operate a motorcycle or motortricycle on public roadways. You must pass the Class F and Class M written, vision, road sign, and motorcycle skills tests. Graduated driver license requirements for details. School bus endorsement is required for anyone transporting students from school, and to and from school bus endorsement is required for carrying more than ten passengers. A school bus endorsement may be issued to a driver age 21 or older who holds a Class E (referred to as a "for-hire" or "chauffeur") license or a commercial license with a Passenger (P) endorsement. A school bus endorsement can be suspended for one year if a person fails to pass any drug, alcohol, or chemical test administered in accordance with any federal or state law, rule or regulation regarding the operation of a school bus. Don't delay! Driving without a valid license can result in a traffic ticket. And not being able to provide proof of your identity with your Missouri driver's license when you need to can be a hassle. If you suspect your driver's license has been stolen and may be used by someone else to steal your identity, you should file a police report along with requesting a replacement.
