I have discovered a missing or lost drivers license or your card has been damaged beyond readability, then you must replace it as soon as possible. Luckily, the Missouri driver's license replacement process is a simple one that must be directed at person at any driver license office managed by the Missouri Department of Revenue (DOR). You need to submit certain information about your driving record well as pay a fee for a duplicate card. If you need to replace lost drivers license documentation, then you should report the missing document, especially if you suspect theft. Doing so helps to protect you in the event that your original drivers license get used for identity theft or other fraudulent purposes. Continue reading the sections outlined below to learn how to replace drivers license credentials in Missouri. When is a replacement drivers license required in Missouri? Missouri state law requires every driver to be in possession of a valid copy of drivers license documentation whenever operating a motor vehicle, so replacing it is imperative any time a license is lost, stolen or mutilated. You also need a replacement drivers license if your name, address or gender has changed or if you wish to add a disability, veteran or boater identification symbol to your credential. Many newlicweds and divorces request a name change on driver license cards to reflect their new legal name.

Similarly, motorists who have experience drastic physical changes should consider updating their license photo. Quick drivers license replacement is necessary to avoid being ticketed for driving without proper documentation. In addition to driving illegally, not having a valid copy of drivers license credentials can cause problems in other areas of life such as access to credit, rental cars, employment, etc. The Missouri Department of Revenue offers several options for replacement of drivers licenses. Most people will want to visit a local DOR office during normal business hours. You should call ahead before replacing drivers license documentation in person because hours and days of operation can vary by location. Most driver license offices are open between 8 a.m. and 4 p.m. on non-holiday weekdays and some offer extended weekend hours. Missouri does not currently offer drivers the option of ordering a drivers license copy online but you may use the MO DOR's online app if you need to update your driver license address on file before applying for a license replacement. Every Missouri duplicate drivers license applicant must meet certain requirements and provide adequate proof of identity to receive a new driving license card. First, you may only apply for a DMV duplicate license in MO if your current license is not due to expire within six months (184 days) of the date of your request. All requests for credentials due to expire within the next six months will be processed as a drivers license renewal instead of a replacement. Second, you must provide one acceptable proof of identity. The DOR provides an extensive list of acceptable identification documents and prefers to receive documents that include a photo. Photo documents acceptable for replacement drivers license purposes include a U.S. passport, a military ID card, a student ID card or a work ID card. If a photo ID document is unavailable, then you may get copy of drivers license credentials using your Social Security card, a birth certificate or another type of document that shows your name and date of birth or your name plus signature. Duplicate drivers license applicants must also provide a document that verifies their residential address in Missouri. If your mailing address is different from your residential address, then you must provide proof of it as well. Acceptable proofs of address for replacement drivers license purposes include utility bills, lease agreements, mortgage statements, voter registration records, postcard, a utility bill, a housing rental contract and a bank statement to name a few. Some applicants replacing drivers license documentation may choose to provide additional documents to verify their residence. Thirdly, Missouri residents requesting a replacement drivers license must provide a recent photograph taken within the past year. This requirement applies to all replacement applications except those submitted by mail. While living in another location, The MO DOS allows mail-in drivers license replacement applications for members of the armed forces serving out-of-state. Non-military members should call or email the DOS for more information. Military members and their dependents who need a replacement drivers license can download and complete the mail-in application form. You should make sure to sign the form by hand and include the requested documents and your fee payment. Mail the complete duplicate drivers license packet to the address printed on the form, and the DOS will send back a copy by mail. Missouri Drivers License Replacement Fees Presently, there is a fee for MO drivers license replacement, which will vary depending on how long your credentials are valid. For instance, you may request a three-year license for \$22.50, or six-year license for \$25. If you want to replace a lost drivers license that has less than six months until its expiration date, then it will be processed as a renewal and you will need to pay the renewal fees, which also depend on the length of time that the credential is valid for. You may apply and pay for a replacement driver license or nondriver license at any Missouri license office. Missouri REAL ID Information Effective October 1, 2021, you will be required to present a REAL ID-compliant driver license or nondriver ID card, or another form of identification accepted by the Transportation Security Administration, to board domestic flights. Also beginning October 1, 2021, you will be required to present a REAL ID-compliant license or ID card, or another form of acceptable ID, to enter federal facilities, nuclear power plants, and secure areas around airports. To ensure compliance with the REAL ID Act, Missouri citizens must obtain a REAL ID compliant license or ID card. HOW TO APPLY YOU can apply for a REAL ID-compliant driver license or nondriver ID card at one of Missouri's more than 170 license office locations. You will be required to submit the following valid, original documents demonstrating proof of each item at the time you apply. Identity (one acceptable document to verify full legal name, date of birth), Lawful Status (the United States (one acceptable document to verify United States citizenship or immigration status); Social Security Number (one acceptable document); Missouri Residency (two acceptable documents verifying your Missouri residential address); and Additional items, such as a certified marriage license or court order, you may be required to verify a new or prior name change if your name is different from the name on your identity and date of birth verification document. Utilize the Department's interactive guide to ensure you have the documents required to apply for your REAL ID. You may also refer to our complete list of acceptable documents for REAL ID-compliant license and ID card processing. IMPORTANT: When applying for a REAL ID-compliant license or ID card, please allow time for its processing and mailing (typically 10-15 days). If you need to fly on October 1, 2021, and you wait to renew until September 30, 2021, you will not receive your REAL ID-compliant license or REAL ID card in time to fly. Consider renewing no later than September 1, 2021, if you will need to fly on or soon after October 1, 2021, to allow sufficient time for delivery of your license or ID card. MILITARY POLICY CHANGE The U.S. Department of Defense (DoD) recently finalized an update to its DoD-wide installation security policy and is in the process of no longer accepting noncompliant marked cards across all of its facilities and installations. This means the military is in the process of no longer accepting driver licenses or nondriver identification cards marked as being noncompliant with REAL ID for the purposes of accessing a military base. This policy change impacts DoD installations in all states, not just Missouri. REAL ID-compliance is required for anyone seeking access to a DoD facility, whether they are a civilian or military member. REAL ID PURPOSES In the upper right-hand corner, Anyone attempting to access a military base with a Missouri-issued license or ID card marked as "NOT FOR REAL ID PURPOSES" may be denied entry. you will need to present acceptable proof of identification in order to receive a replacement driver's license in Missouri. Acceptable proofs of identification include a valid passport, certified copy of a birth certificate, and/or valid Social Security Card. To replace a lost or stolen driver's license in Missouri, you will need to present your Social Security card, proof of your legal name, date of birth, and address (such as a valid U.S. passport, birth certificate, or other government-issued photo ID), and payment for the licensing fee. You may also be asked to provide proof of legal presence in the United States. If your driver's license is lost or stolen in Missouri, you can apply for a temporary driver's license at any Missouri Driver License Office. You will need to bring the following documents: your valid ID, proof of legal presence in the US, and two proofs of Missouri residence (utility bills, bank statements, etc.). You may also need to pass a vision screening and pay the fee. Yes, there are restrictions on the type of replacement driver's license issued in Missouri. The type of license issued to a replacement applicant must match the class and type of license previously held by the applicant. Additionally, if the applicant's previous license is expired, the replacement license will also be issued with an expiration date that matches the original expiration date. To replace a lost or stolen Commercial Driver's License (CDL) in the state of Missouri, you can visit your local Driver Licensing Office and bring the necessary documents and payment. You will need to provide proof of identification, proof of legal presence, proof of Social Security Number, two proofs of Missouri residency, and payment for the replacement fee. Yes, there are age restrictions on replacing a lost or stolen driver's license in Missouri. People under the age of 21 must present proof of identity (i.e. birth certificate, passport) to replace their license. If you fail to replace your lost or stolen driver's license within the allowed time frame in Missouri, you may be subject to a fine and may have your driving privileges suspended. Additionally, traffic violations resulting from the lack of a valid license may also be subject to additional penalties as determined by the court.
