To view historical imagery in Google Earth, open the application and search for a location. Click on the "Historical imagery" option in the toolbar or click on the "View Historical Imagery" button. This feature is not available with the Map basemap, so you need to switch to Satellite mode to enable it. You can also turn on timelapse by clicking on the "Timelapse" button. A timeline appears at the top right of the screen, showing the different dates and corresponding imagery. To navigate through time, click on a specific year or use the "Previous" or "Next" buttons to move forward. To lock the latest imagery, click on the "Last page" button. You can minimize the historical imagery toolbar by clicking on the "Collapse" button at the top right of the screen. The toolbar will remain active as a floating chip, even after minimization. Some tips to keep in mind: * When viewing historical imagery, 3D building features are turned off for optimization. * Satellite image availability is represented on the slider, and image availability may change as you explore. * Years are marked by dots, with smaller dots indicating additional months. * If a previously selected year becomes unavailable, its dot on the slider turns gray. In addition to viewing historical imagery, Google Earth also offers a feature called Timeline view. This interactive visual layer can help you manage multiple project parts, such as: * Project tasks * Marketing campaigns * Schedules * Cross-team collaborations * Any future plans To create a timeline view in your spreadsheet, click on the "Insert timeline" button at the top of your Sheets menu and select your data range. Your account and all devices: At the top, turn Location History on or off. Only a certain device: Under "This device" or "Devices on this account," turn the device on or off.If you delete your Location History on Google Maps, some personalized experiences may be lost or degrade, such as real-time traffic information and tailored recommendations. However, deleting Location History does not erase all location data saved in your Google Account, especially if Web & App Activity is enabled. For instance, location data might still be retained for activities like searching, using the camera app, or accessing certain Google services. Your device may also send diagnostic information to Google about its performance with Location History, which is processed under their privacy policy. The information your device shares with Google includes details about your battery usage, Wi-Fi connections, GPS settings, and crashes, as well as which apps you use to manage Location History. This data helps improve various aspects of Google services, such as battery life, location accuracy, and overall performance.
