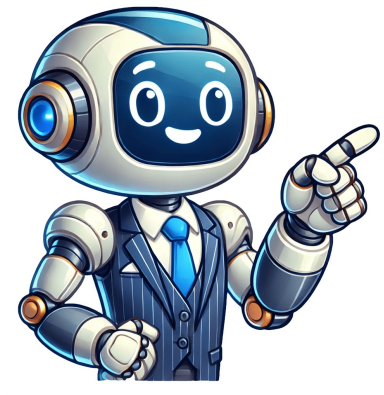

It is concerned with the teaching and guideline of the training of the occupation among economists. The institution was made to stimulate and encourage the study and progress of art and science of economics in all areas and to include experience in the economics profession, to also control the activities of its members, to be able to form a common front of advising to the government on the best strategies to approve for the nation. Institute of Chartered Accountants of Nigeria(ICAN): ICAN is the body that is in charge of the guideline of the accounting practice in Nigeria. They train and register all successful members who pass their exams and are then familiarized as chartered accountants. It is a very costly process but it is worth it after record-keeping because there are few companies that will hire an accountant that is not chartered. Nigerian Computer Society (NCS): The NCS is the top body in charge of all information and technology professionals in the country. The COREN is authorized to regulate and control the training of engineers and the practice of engineering in Nigeria. Chartered Institute of Private Management of Nigeria (CIPM): This body was established to house all the experts of Personnel Management in Nigeria. Their purpose is to Promote excellence in the profession and also regulate the working morals of its professionals to train its followers on how to supply value in their jobs. National Association of Nigerian Nurses and Midwives(NANNM): The association was formed in 1938 and listed in1943. It is a qualified trade union body for nurses and midwives. It was recognized to bring together and establish all nurses and midwives in the country, as far as you have been given the license to practice the profession. The NIM is in charge of training and regulating the practice of management professionals in the country. Nigerian Institute of Quantity Surveyors: NIQS is a controlling body for all Quantity surveyors in Nigeria. Functions of Some Computer Professionals A computer manager has the overall responsibility of the computer department. He ensures the computer installation runs efficiently, in satisfying the company's needs, of an organization, which it serves. The computer manager is the communicator of the computer department. He or she is a computer professional, who often has to make presentations to superior officers in the corporation. A computer manager ensures that every piece of equipment in the computer room is in good working condition, and should be upgraded when the need arises. A System Analyst carries out feasibility studies on a system. He or she works with other individuals within an organization to evaluate their information needs, designs computer software and hardware to meet those needs, and then implements the information systems. A System Analyst plays an important role in the systems development process. He or she performs the following tasks in the computer department. A System Analyst interacts with the customers to know their needs and requirements. He or she interacts with the designers of the program to convey the form of the software. He or she interacts with and guides the developers to keep track of system development. Programmers work closely with a system analyst, to either create new software or review existing programs. A programmer uses programming languages like Basic, C++, Java, etc in highly structured systems. Programmers are of three categories: Application Programmers, System Programmers, and Maintenance Programmers. Several programmers work together as a team. Simple programs can be written in a few hours, but some complex programs may require more than a year, to work on, and test run. Computer Programmer. One of the most important steps, in creating a new information system, is to prepare and train users. A computer trainer provides classes for users, by giving them the opportunity to explore a new system. They train people to use computer hardware and software. Computer Educator. This is the professional that carries out repairs and maintenance jobs on the computer. A computer engineer is an engineering professional, who not only possesses the training of an electrical engineer but also has certificates, related to the field of computer science. A computer engineer must have the skill and knowledge of software design and implementation. He or she must have an understanding of electronic devices such as microprocessors and chips, and local and wide area networks. While computer hardware configuration varies widely, a repair technician will work with five general categories of hardware, such as desktop computers, laptops, servers, computer clusters, and smartphone computing. Technicians occasionally repair a range of peripherals such as input devices, output devices, and data storage devices. The technicians, who are involved in system administration, might also work with networking hardware such as routers, switches, fibre optics, and wireless networks. A computer technician, could take actions as minor as adjusting one or several settings on the computer, and also, apply more involved techniques like installing, uninstalling, or reinstalling various software packages. Computer Technician. Computer scientists work on the software aspect of computer systems, as opposed to the hardware aspect that computer engineers mainly focus on. Computer scientists focus their work and research on specific areas, such as data structure development and design, software engineering and information theory, database language theory, and computer graphics. Their foundation is the theoretical study of computing. They are required to possess a BSc, or MSc in Computer Science or a closely related discipline such as mathematics. Computer Scientist: Charles Babbage. They enter data into the computer, before giving instructions to the computer to process the data. They print out or send out data or information to various departments. They are mostly seen in a minicomputer, microcomputer, or mainframe computer environment. Sometimes the data entry staff are also called computer operators. Some of the activities of computer operators include: starting the computer, changing ink or ribbons in the printer, loading the printer with paper, and cleaning disk drives and other peripherals. The academic requirement, for positions as computer operators, is not as demanding as that of computer programmers. An SSCE or NECO certificate is required and augmented by an additional certificate, in computer application. Some have training ranging from local training, in schools, to certificate courses, and diplomas from polytechnics. Often, companies will provide on-the-job training to promising personnel. Database administrators are responsible for structuring, coordinating, creating, updating, and maintaining databases. This is a person responsible for the installation, configuration, upgrade, administration, monitoring, and maintenance of databases in an organization. This is a programmer who specializes in the development of World Wide Web applications or distributed network applications that are run over HTTP from a web server to a web browser. A webmaster's duties are focused on designing, creating, monitoring, and evaluating corporate websites. Webmasters combine technical Internet skills with design and layout expertise. Technical writers explain in writing how a computer program works. A technical writer works closely with a system analyst, and users to document an information system, and to create clearly written user manuals. This is a person responsible for the maintenance of computer hardware and software, that comprises a computer network. This normally includes deploying, configuring, maintaining, and monitoring active data networks or converged infrastructure environments and related network equipment. Network managers ensure that existing information and communication systems are implemented. A network manager is also responsible, for ensuring that computer security and individual privacy are protected. This corporate body is vested with the power to control and supervise the computing profession in Nigeria.Below are functions performed by CPN.Establishing the minimum knowledge and skill requirements for anybody wishing to work in the field of computing.Create and maintain a record of individuals who have registered to practise computers in Nigeria in accordance with the decree, and periodically publish a list of those individuals.Organising and controlling the practice of computing in the country.Managing the Nigerian computing industry.Screening and registration of all corporate organisations in Nigeria that are or want to be involved in the sale or use of computing facilities or the provision of computing services.Maintaining high levels of professionalism, ethics, and discipline.Developing academic standards for computing programs/degrees such as computer engineering, computer science, and information science.Accreditation of educational institutions that grant degrees, appraisal of their programmes, and certifications in computers.Carrying on exams in collaboration with organisations and outside organisations for the council.Publication of the council's operations.Making professional computer works, such as books, journals, magazines, bulletins, etc., available for publication.The Nigeria Association of Computing Students (NACOS) was formed in July 1993 by a group of students, with the Nigerian Computer Society (NCS) serving as its parent organisation.It gives students in all IT-related fields the chance to coordinate and organise their efforts to spotlight and advance important topics.Students majoring in computer-related fields such as computer science, computer engineering, information technology, etc., make up NACOS members.Functions of the Nigeria Association of Computing Students (NACOS)Photo of people sitting near wooden table.
