The verification letter will subsequently be sent to the requested FSDO or faxed to the training facility designated by the pilot. If the foreign pilot has never been issued a US based on foreign certificate, he/she must also obtain a letter of verification. Once the letter is in hand, he/she may go to a foreign pilot designee to get his/her new US certificate based on foreign. The letter is valid for six months.
