Orientation can be accessed online in your student portal. High school transcripts should be submitted to Collin College upon high school graduation and are required for First Time in College students. College transcripts are required from all institutions attended. Unless exempt, all students must take the Texas Success Initiative (TSI) Assessment to enroll. Visit the TSI website to learn more about the pre-assessment (required prior to testing), test options and fees, exemption criteria and remote/online testing.
