Flasks of disinfectant solution must be placed correctly to avoid leakage or contamination. Important safety information: never block the ventilation openings on the left side, as this could lead to equipment failure. Disinfectant solutions and alcohol require proper handling, including wearing a face mask, gloves, and protective clothing to prevent skin contact and aspiration. The device should only be used with compatible endoscopes and connecting tubes, as listed in the user manual. Regular maintenance and inspection are necessary to ensure the device functions properly. Expired disinfectant solutions must be disposed of according to local regulations, and all applicable national and state guidelines should be followed when disposing of the equipment and accessories. 1. The RFID function, which enables certain operations, is initially deactivated and must be enabled by contacting Olympus if needed. In case of equipment failure to detect the user ID, applying the provided user ID master card to the RFID reader allows recognition as the master ID. However, this may compromise safety and equipment functionality. For reprocessing Gyrus ACMI endoscopes, proper fit into the OER-Pro basin is ensured by rotating the irrigation/biopsy port. The MAJ-1904 instruction manual outlines necessary endoscope configuration for adequate reprocessing. During setup, it's essential to check each endoscope in the reprocessing basin for excessive scratches that could cause water leakage. Any irregularities should be reported to Olympus for repair. The setup process involves specific steps for different types of endoscopes, as outlined in the "OER-Pro Quick Reference Guide."
