When I set it up for the kids in school, I separate the cards, and put the onsets on the left and the rimes on the right or I use 2 mini pocket charts side by side. These are the mini pocket charts from Target. I love them and I bought about 14 of them in August. (yes, turquoise :)) They're all over my room. Kids get extra practice writing the CVC words with the addition of recording sheets. There are answer keys in each set, as well. I made a set for each of the five vowel sounds.
