This issue is unusual. I'm building my code using CMake in VS2022 on an Ubuntu Linux 22.04 virtual machine, and it works fine when run directly from the terminal. However, when trying to debug it with Visual Studio, I encounter an error: qt.qpa.xcb: could not connect to display qt.qpa.plugin: From Qt 6.5.0, xcb-cursor0 or libxcb-cursor0 is required to load the Qt xcb platform plugin. The application failed to start because no Qt platform plugin could be initialized. Reinstalling the application may fix this problem. Available platform plugins are: eglfs, wayland, xcb, vkkhrdisplay, offscreen, vnc, wayland-egl, linuxfb, minimalegl. libxcb-cursor0 is installed. I set QT\_DEBUG\_PLUGINS to 1 in an attempt to debug this, but VS did not show the output. UPDATE: I managed to get VS to create a log file showing the error message. The log file indicates that the Qt platform plugin "qeglf" was not found, despite being available in the /opt/Qt/6.8.0/gcc 64/plugins/platforms directory. The Qt application has started processing plugin metadata for various platforms. It has loaded and verified metadata from several plugins, including Wayland, Qxcb, and QVkKhrDisplay. The metadata includes information about the plugin's class name, version, debug status, and key names. However, when trying to load some plugins (qoffscreen.debug), it reported that the shared library was not found, which indicates that these plugins are not available on this system. The application continues processing metadata from other plugins, including QOffscreenIntegrationPlugin and QVkKhrDisplayIntegrationPlugin. The process of loading plugin metadata and verification is ongoing, with new messages being received every few seconds. A list of plugins has been retrieved using Qt's metadata system. The plugins are: 1. QVncIntegrationPlugin for VNC support 2. QWaylandEglPlatformIntegrationPlugin for LinuxFB support 3. QLinuxFbIntegrationPlugin for LinuxFB support Each plugin has metadata that includes its ID, class name, and version number. The system is now checking if certain plugins are installed. If a shared library is not found, the plugin is skipped. The plugins, including qminimal.so, which has metadata for minimal support. Specifically, the problem seems to be with loading the "/home/user/app/platforms/libqxcb.so" library, resulting in an error message related to xcb plugin issues. You might find their discussion helpful. However, @Pablo-J-Rogina has indicated that this won't be beneficial to you, so it's best to disregard it for now. @Pablo-J-Rogina, regarding your inquiry about Xlaunch being an xserver, could you clarify further?
